Residents and visitors both appreciate the unique shopping districts like Utica Square; festivals like Mayfest and Oktoberfest; fine dining; gaming, and horse racing. The outdoor trails of the River Parks or Turkey Mountain offer the perfect terrain for hiking, biking or running, while the Blue Dome, Brookside and Brady Arts Districts supply an exciting nightlife.

On The Cover *Guthrie Green, an Urban Oasis*

Tulsans don't call their city "boomtown" for nothing. A quick walk through the streets of downtown offers a glimpse of a city revitalizing its roots with growth and redevelopment. Amidst this renaissance sits Guthrie Green, an urban garden and performance space which opened in September of 2012, bringing the latest boom to downtown Tulsa's landscape.

Named for famous Oklahoma singer and songwriter Woody Guthrie, Guthrie Green features outdoor music and films by night, while providing a peaceful escape and family activities for day-time visitors. The park is situated in Tulsa's Brady Arts District, lined by the city block of Brady and Cameron streets and Boston and Cincinnati avenues. In addition to the performance stage and large fountain, tree lined paths, shaded structures, and a large lawn make this an urban green space unlike any other.

Guthrie Green is part of a larger renaissance in the Brady Arts District. Just across the street from the park visitors will find the Zarrow Center for Arts and Education, as well as a number of other art galleries due for completion throughout 2013 including Philbrook Museum of Art's Eugene B. Adkins Collection and Study Center, the George R. Kravis II Contemporary Design Collection; and the Woody Guthrie Center, the new permanent home of the Woody Guthrie Archives.

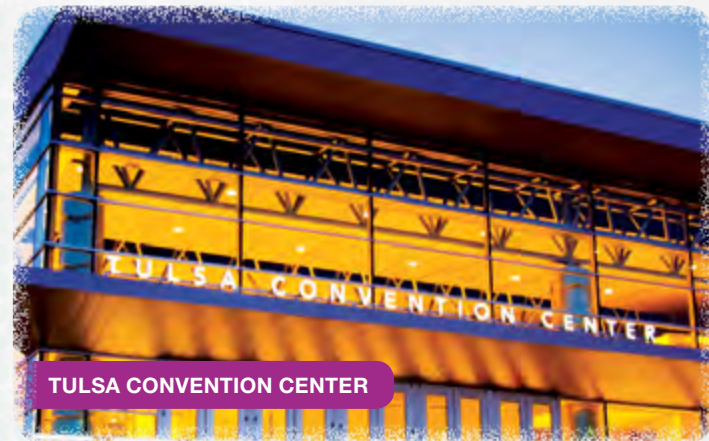

Downtown The Experience

Visitors and residents alike can tell you that Tulsa's interesting and unexpected charm can't be found anywhere else. The unique marriage of Tulsa's historic Native American roots and oil boom heritage create a city rich in arts, culture and entertainment.



ONEOK FIELD



TULSA CONVENTION CENTER

While the entire metro reflects a broad scope of styles and vibes, downtown is a stand-alone experience. A new arena; baseball stadium; renovated hotels; restored attractions; and numerous venues, nightlife and entertainment options create a one-spot stop for friends and family looking for fun.

Downtown's anchors – the BOK Center and ONEOK Field, reflect just a portion of the nearly \$1 billion invested in the area. The 18,500-seat BOK Center (pronounced B-O-K, for Bank of Oklahoma) attracts premier entertainers regularly performing to sold-out crowds.

ONEOK (pronounced one-oak) Field is home to the Tulsa Drillers, a minor league baseball team affiliated with the Colorado Rockies. The field

is perfect for a Friday night baseball game, complete with a fireworks display over a beautiful backdrop of downtown Tulsa.

After the game, check out one of downtown's thriving entertainment districts boasting one-of-a-kind music venues, restaurants, art galleries and night life. For a full listing, check out the entertainment districts section on page 12.

Downtown is also home to one of the finest collections of art deco architecture nation-wide, ranking with cities like Miami and Chicago. The meticulously restored Mayo Hotel, a 1920s legend, was once the state's tallest building and a destination for stars and celebrities. Today, the Mayo lives again as luxury lofts and hotel rooms. Reopened in

2009, the Crystal Ballroom, restored in every way to its 1925 appearance, is truly an art deco renovation project to behold. Another member of the National Register of Historic Places, the Atlas Life Building, was renovated into a Marriott hotel property with care given to maintaining a piece of Tulsa's history.

A visit to Tulsa's downtown will display the community's unique ability to integrate its deep respect for the past into a renaissance of modern times, developing the deep roots of eras gone by into a new, exciting future.

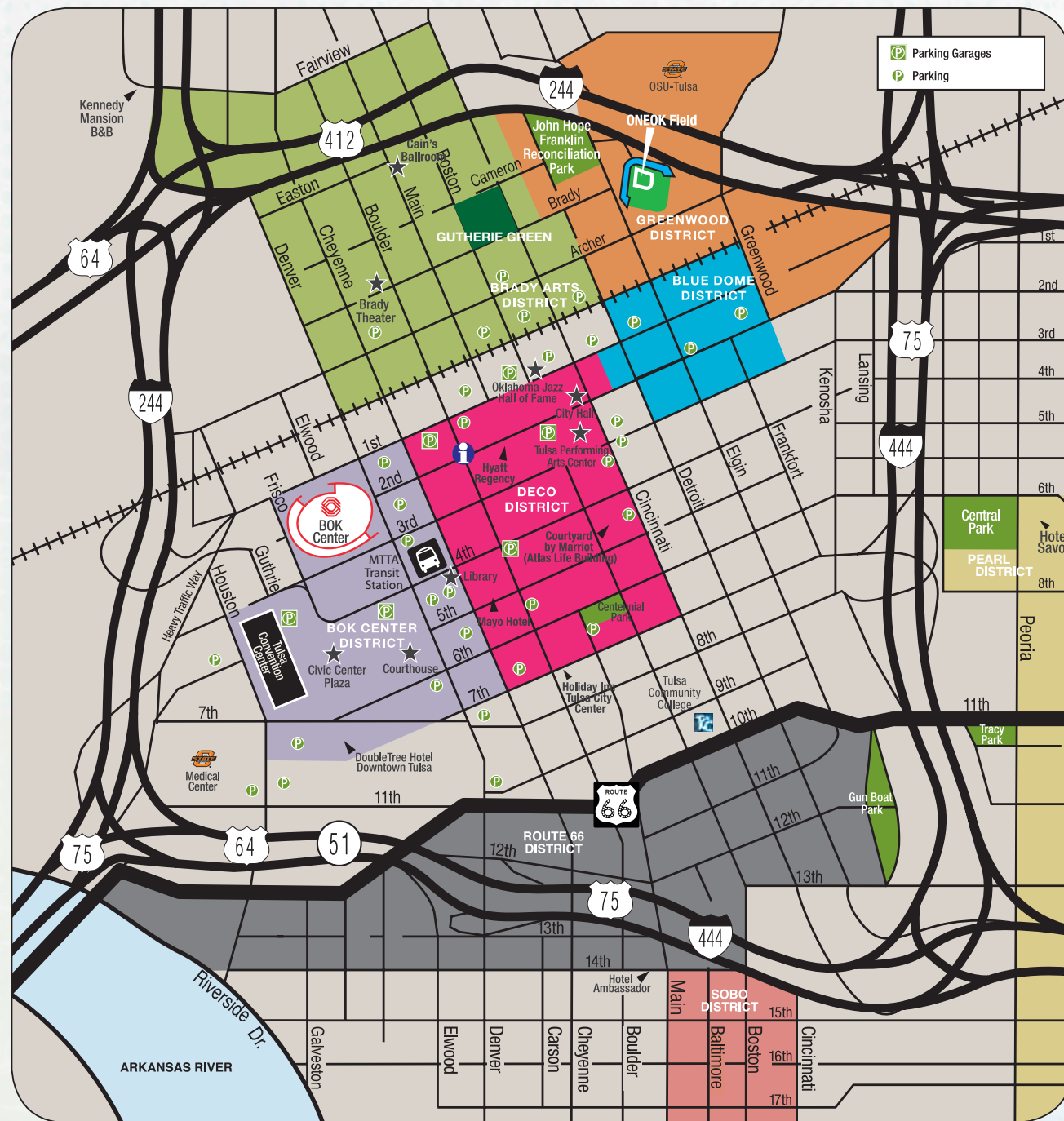

Entertainment Districts Supply Plenty of Nightlife

As Tulsa's bright sun fades in the west, beckoning neon lights signal an exciting nightlife emerging in the city's numerous entertainment districts.

The excitement permeates the clubs and restaurants in areas such as the Brady Arts, Brookside, Cherry Street and Blue Dome districts, known for attracting music scene makers and birthing the "Tulsa Sound."

Seemingly, as a tribute to Tulsa's importance in the entertainment world, the BOK Center glitters in downtown, attracting world-class entertainers from Taylor Swift and Carrie Underwood to Journey, Elton John and Sir Paul McCartney. It also

serves as the home court for Tulsa's newest sports franchise – the WNBA Tulsa Shock team.

Alongside the BOK Center, several downtown Tulsa districts provide an active, trendy nightlife.



THE BRADY ARTS DISTRICT

There's plenty happening in this historical district known for its funky vibe. Located downtown on Brady St. and the surrounding blocks from Cheyenne to Elgin Ave., the Brady is definitely booming, with plans under way to create an entire, walkable arts district. A number of the older buildings are in the process of renovation and will open in 2013, like the Mathews Warehouse, which will soon house art collections from Philbrook Museum, the University of Tulsa, 108 | Contemporary and the Woody Guthrie Archives.

The recently completed Guthrie Green brings an urban park to the Brady, with gardens, trails, fountains and an outdoor concert space. Be sure to visit often for an expanded landscape housing any and everything the artistic soul might desire.

Amidst the many art galleries, shops, restaurants and nightclubs of the Brady, you'll find two historic entertainment venues, the Brady Theater and Cain's Ballroom.

The Brady Theater, built between 1912 and 1914, was originally designed to serve as the city's

Municipal Auditorium and was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1979. Today "the Old Lady on Brady" continues to be used for a wide variety of concerts and theatrical productions.

Cain's Ballroom, a historic venue called the birthplace of Western Swing and the Carnegie Hall of Western Music, is also listed on the National Register of Historic Places. So much talent has passed through its doors, from Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys to Hank Williams and Patsy Cline. Later, names such as Van Halen, The Police and INXS joined the ranks. The grand ballroom continues to attract concert-goers as diverse as the music that draws them there.

BLUE DOME DISTRICT

The Blue Dome District is another center for downtown nightlife, centered at Second St. and Elgin Ave. and expanding into the surrounding blocks. Once a 1920s gas station attracting Route 66 travellers with its art deco blue dome, this gem now sits at the heart of numerous pubs, restaurants, and a vintage bowling alley. Several festivals take place here including the Blue Dome Arts Festival, FreeTulsa Music Festival and St. Patrick's Day Festival.

GREENWOOD DISTRICT

Once called "Black Wall Street," Tulsa's historic Greenwood District boasts the world-class ONEOK Field, a downtown baseball stadium and home to the Tulsa Drillers. The stadium supports further development with new venues nearing completion in the surrounding areas. Artifacts from the historic district's past can be found at the Greenwood Cultural Center, the Mabel B. Little Heritage Center, John Hope Franklin Reconciliation Park, and heard at the Oklahoma Jazz Hall of Fame located in the Jazz Depot in the city's core business district.

CHERRY STREET

Cherry Street is more than its name implies—this colorful seven-block area of 15th Street between Peoria and Utica wears many faces. On Saturday mornings during the growing season, you'll find striped tents brimming with area growers' harvest at the Cherry Street Farmer's Market. Later in the day, you'll love browsing the shops, bistros and cafes. And in the evening, you'll find restaurants with bars catering to those seeking a trendy and upscale nightlife.

BROOKSIDE

Brookside, located just south of downtown on Peoria Avenue between 33rd and 51st Streets, is another popular nightlife venue. Here, you'll find dining, dancing and trendy clubs. DECO DISTRICT

The Deco District is also home to numerous festivals, including Mayfest, an outdoor tribute to arts and music, scheduled for May 16-19.

PEARL DISTRICT

One of Tulsa's up-and-coming districts, the Pearl District, is located on Sixth Street between Peoria and Utica, right outside downtown Tulsa. This corridor between downtown and the University of Tulsa is quickly becoming one of the hip new places to open a business, bar or restaurant. With a new art bar, Lot No. 6, a great Farmer's Market during growing season, a beautiful park and a number of plans in the works, the Pearl District is an ever-growing place to hang out.

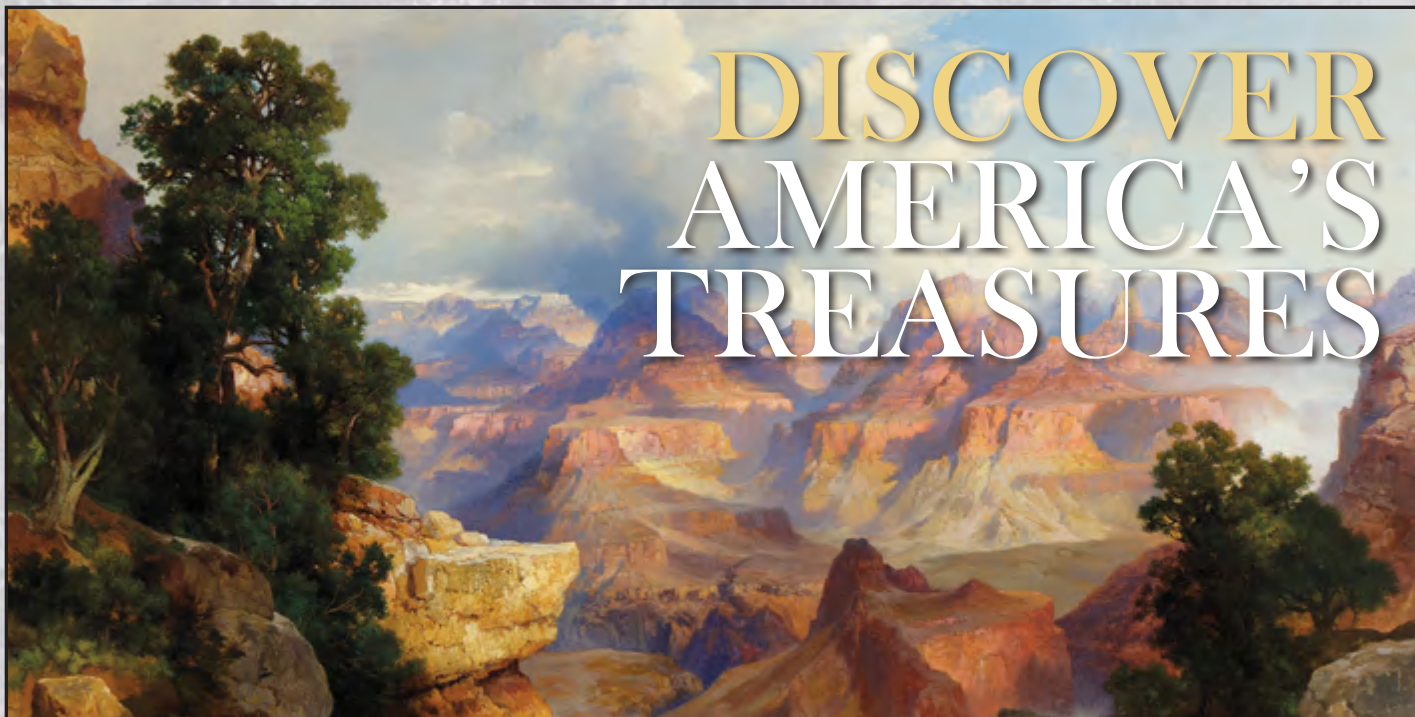

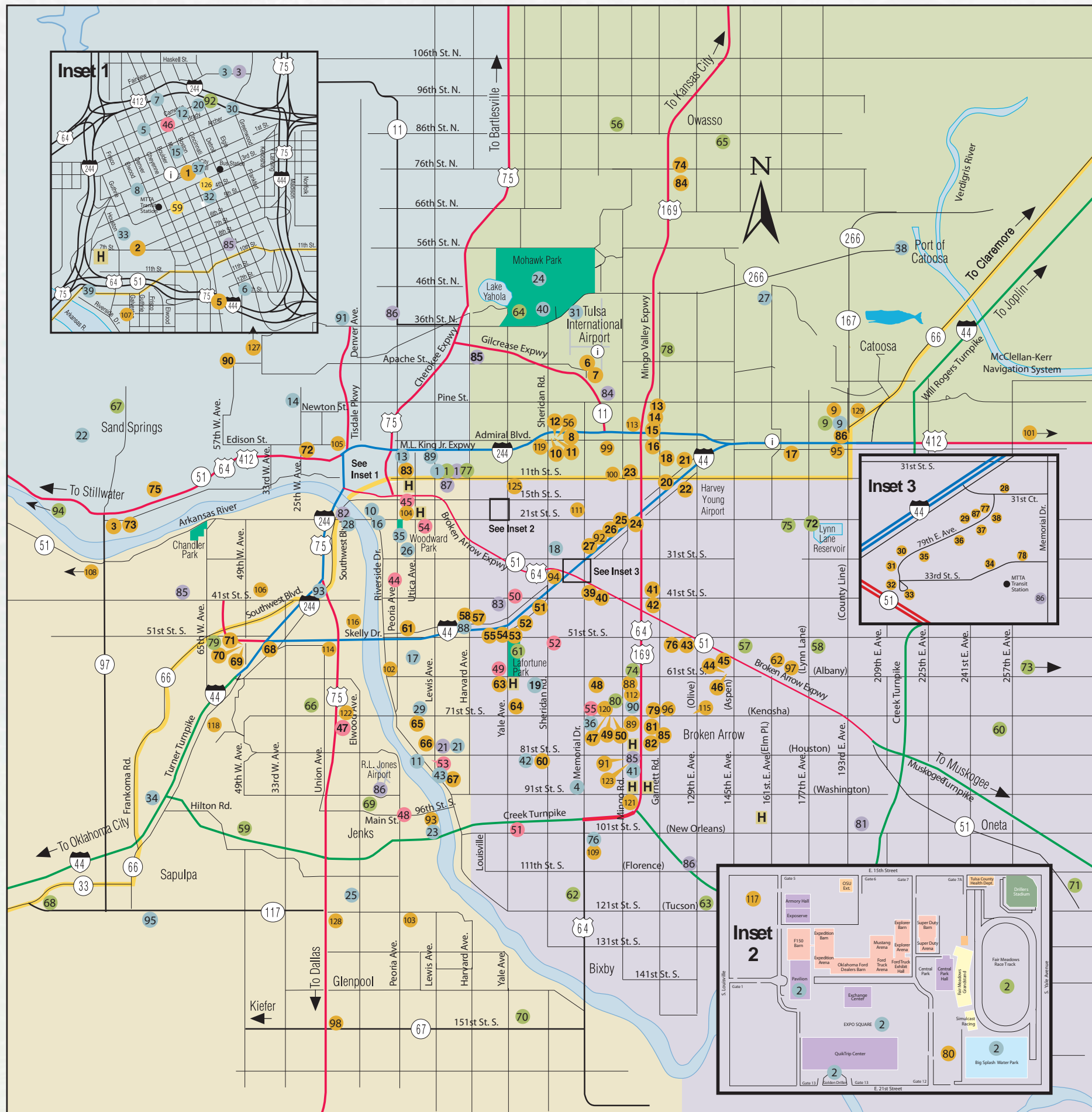

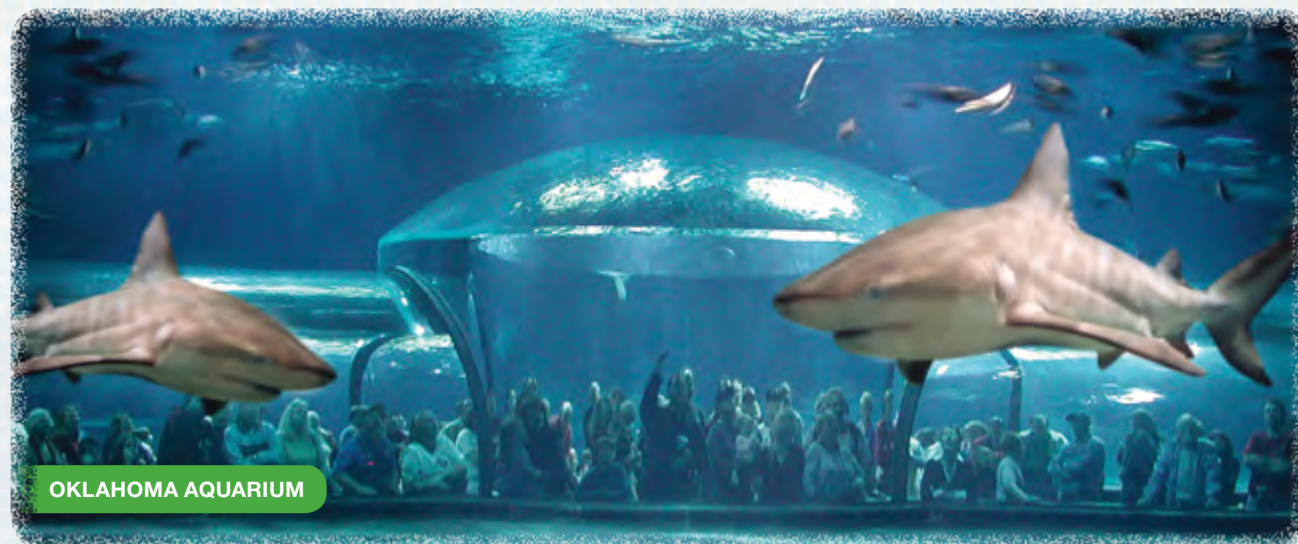
Your adventures will uncover remarkable finds, like Frank Lloyd Wright's only skyscraper, a historic oil well and a true tall grass prairie complete with roaming bison. Traverse the lands of the Cherokees, Creeks and Osages and take a spin on America's Main Street – Route 66.

Or step inside a museum honoring Oklahoma's favorite son, Will Rogers. A visit to the weekend homestead of an oil baron finds you marvelling at the Western art collection amassed inside a museum or delighting at the exotic and native animals grazing nearby.

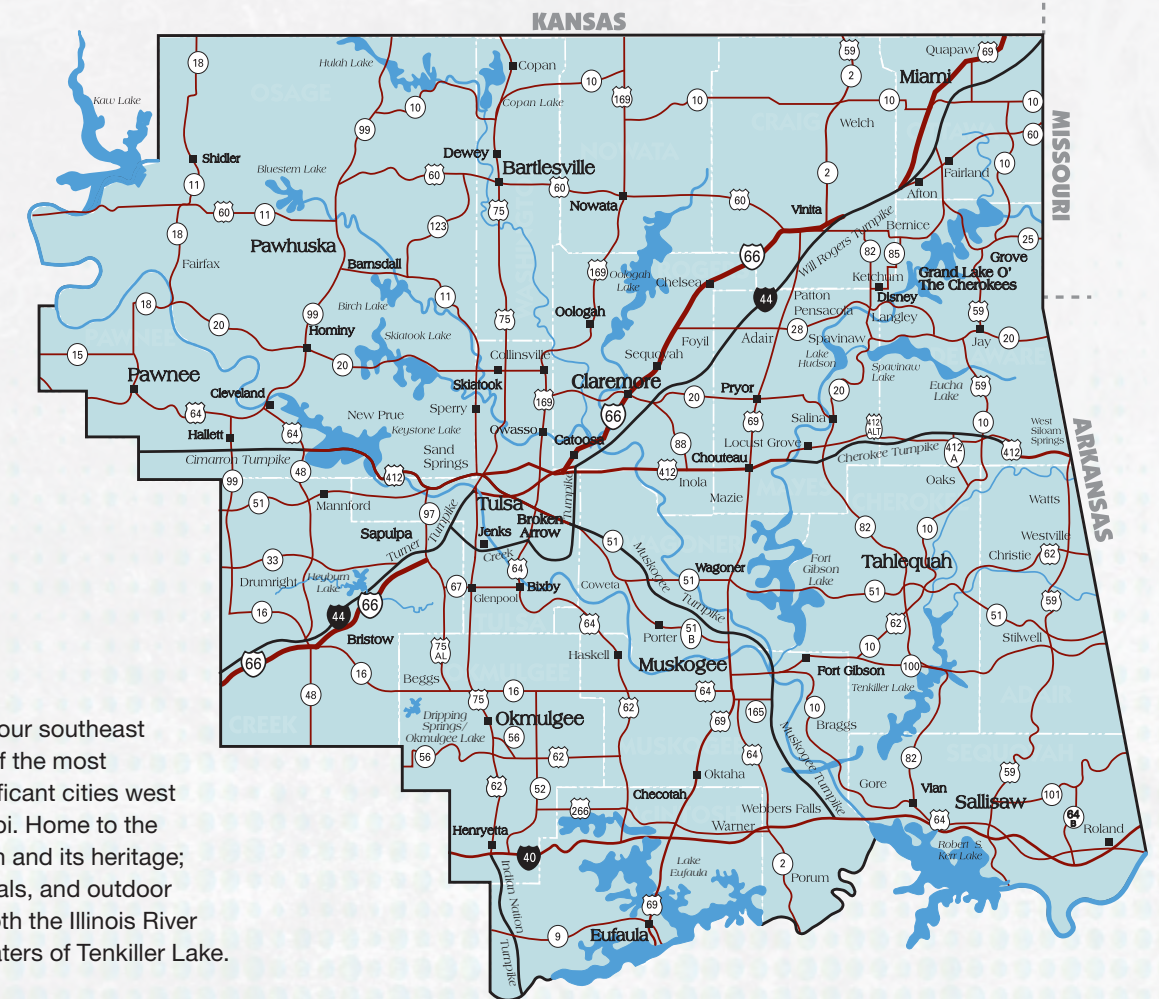
History was made here, and the many museums and historic sites pay tribute to those of diverse cultures who first ventured into an unsettled land.

Be sure to take in the beautiful scenery – from waving prairie grasslands to lush Ozark foothills – as you discover hill-top wineries, gorgeous parks, sparkling lakes and clear streams.

The following pages contain some suggestions for your day-trip adventures, trips you'll be able to make in a day, garnering memories that will last a lifetime.



OKLAHOMA AQUARIUM



TAHLEQUAH

A little over an hour southeast of Tulsa is one of the most historically significant cities west of the Mississippi. Home to the Cherokee Nation and its heritage; numerous festivals, and outdoor recreation on both the Illinois River and the clear waters of Tenkiller Lake.

BARTLESVILLE

Less than an hour away you'll find a town whose oil-rich heritage, art deco history and cowboy culture combine to create an interesting vibe. The arts and festivals abound.

Hidden away in the rugged Osage Hills of Northeastern Oklahoma, Woolaroc was established in 1925 as the ranch retreat of oilman Frank Phillips. The 3,700-acre ranch features a wildlife preserve and a museum. Explore an outstanding collection of western art and artifacts, Native American material and one of the finest collections of Colt firearms in the world.

CLAREMORE

Enter Claremore the historical way, via Route 66, the "Mother Road." Known for its many museums, Claremore is home to the Will Rogers Memorial Museum and the J.M. Davis Arms and Historical Museum.

BROKEN ARROW

In Broken Arrow, you discover a city with the tranquil atmosphere of a small community while offering a variety of cultural, shopping and sporting opportunities. This is close to attractions, lakes and rivers - you'll discover why it was named one of the "Best Places to Live in America" by Money Magazine. The fast-growing suburb boasts hiking trails, a nature park and nine public and private golf courses.

MUSKOGEE

A destination for history, art, nature, shopping and entertainment. Native American history lives at the Ataloa Lodge & Museum and the Five Civilized Tribes Museum. The U.S.S. Batfish, a retired naval submarine, is an always popular attraction, as are the stunning azaleas each April during the Azalea Festival.

PRYOR

Surrounded by lakes, parks, and waterfalls in the foothills of the Ozark Mountains, Pryor is yet another destination for outdoor activity. Lake Hudson is less than 10 minutes away. Pryor is home to Rocklahoma, featuring internationally recognized performers and DAM J.A.M. Bicycle Tour. Other attractions include Dry Gulch U.S.A. and Coo-Y-Yah Museum, home to Cherokee and Osage Indian artifacts, art and local history items.

GRAND LAKE O' THE CHEROKEES

Smaller towns like Grove or Disney offer charming shops, restaurants, entertainment and numerous attractions including Picture in Scripture Amphitheater presenting "The Elijah Factor" this summer. Some of the best fishing in the region is found on Grand Lake, while also boasting areas for water sports.

MIAMI

The longest stretch of Historic Route 66 is found in Miami. Thirteen miles ribbon through the town in far Northeast Oklahoma. The beautifully restored Coleman Theatre, built in 1929, hosted stars like Will Rogers, Bob Hope, Sally Rand and Groucho Marx. Miami is home to several casinos, the Dobson Museum, Twin Bridges State Park, Route 66 Motorcycle Museum and the top-rated Peoria Ridge Golf Course.

JENKS

Across the Arkansas River from Tulsa is Jenks, where the Oklahoma Aquarium brings the ocean and its marine life to America's heartland with the largest bull sharks in captivity held in a walk-through tank. Send the kids crawling through the new Extreme Amazon exhibit to come face-to-face with giant species from under the water's surface. You'll also find sea creatures like octopi, piranhas, sting rays and much more.

OKMULGEE

South of Tulsa is the historical town of Okmulgee, home to the Creek Council House Museum, the seat of government for the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. Housed here is an extensive collection of documents, murals, paintings and artifacts of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation. Enjoy a stroll through the historic downtown, an official "Great American Main Street" winner.

PAWHUSKA

Gateway to the Nature Conservancy's 39,000-acre Tallgrass Prairie, Pawhuska is located on a mere fraction of the original 142 million acres of prairie that spanned the entire center of the United States. This Osage county community, just over an hour northwest of Tulsa, is home to the Osage Nation and its rich history extending back a millennia. Pawhuska is known for the Cavalcade, the world's largest amateur rodeo; the Osage Million Dollar Elm Tree, where

oilmen like Getty, Phillips and Sinclair convened to bid on auctioned oil and gas leases; and the Immaculate Conception Church, that glistens with stunning cobalt blue stained glass windows imported from Germany almost a century ago. Pawhuska is also home to the Drummond Ranch, where Ree Drummond "cooks-up-a-storm" as HGTV's Pioneer Woman.

SAPULPA

Green Country's stretch of Historic Route 66 continues through Sapulpa just southwest of Tulsa, where a bronze bison welcomes you to the community. A photo stop is in order here, as this "Guardian of the Plains" stands twice the size of a normal bison. Sapulpa's authentically renovated storefronts in downtown, house an array of charming shops and restaurants and a visit to the Sapulpa Historical Museum provides a glimpse of life in days gone by.

Hope Plaza, a 16-foot granite structure with three bronze sculptures, depicts actual pictures from the 1921 riot. Titled Hostility, Humiliation and Hope, the three sculptures visually articulate the day's events with unimaginable emotion.

The Tower of Reconciliation at the center of the park is a 25-foot memorial tower that displays the early struggles of Oklahoma Territory with African American and Native American immigration and migration, Civil War battles, statehood and the lively history of Black Wall Street in Greenwood.

River Parks. For Tulsans, those two words define a natural resource like no other, an inextricable part of our past, present and future. The Arkansas River, whether brimming bank-to-bank or meandering around vast sandbars, continues to make its mark on the community birthed along its banks.

The River Parks stretch along 10 miles of the Arkansas with spacious dual trails, serving an estimated one million visitors per year. The trails also include lighting, park furnishings and other amenities. Additionally, the QuikTrip Plaza at 41st Street and Riverside draws visitors and families with its water features and playgrounds.

Festivals, concerts, fireworks and more draw thousands to the park each year for outdoor entertainment. Fishing, kayaking, rowing, rugby and disc golf offer fun and leisure year round. The park is also home to the city's largest collection of bronze wildlife sculptures and other art.

For a slightly more rugged terrain, check out the Turkey Mountain Urban Wilderness Area, with 300 acres of heavily-wooded crests and valleys connected by a maze of dirt trails covered by mountain bikers, cross-country runners and equestrians. The summit offers an imposing sweep of Tulsa from north to south along the river corridor and reinforces the wonder of a green haven in the midst of the city.

River Parks is a unique partnership of nature and urbanization, so close to home, yet the perfect get-away.

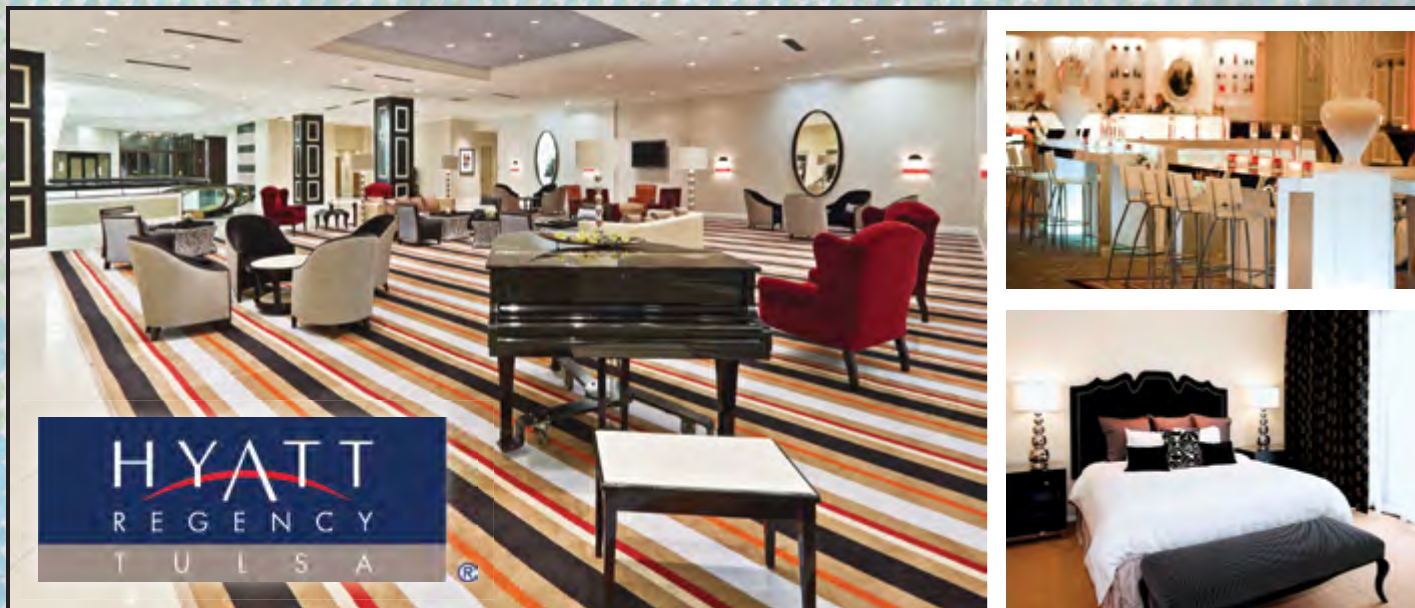

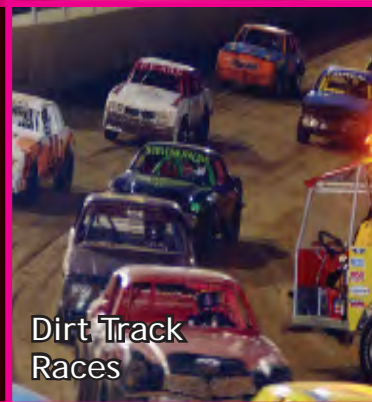
